Portugal and Spain 3/23/2025

Day 1: Lisbon Arrive in Lisbon at any time. Meet your group for a welcome meeting around 6:00 or 7:00 p.m.

You may arrive in Lisbon at any time today. The nearest airport is Lisbon's **Humberto Delgado Airport (LIS)**.

Due to the potential for flight delays or cancellations—and to give you more time to explore the city—we recommend that you consider arriving in Lisbon at least a day in advance. This will also give you time to adjust to the time difference and overcome any jet lag. We can book extra hotel nights for you in Lisbon before and/or after the trip.

Hotel Check-in and Welcome Meeting

Please note that hotel check-in usually opens around **2:00-3:00 p.m.**, so if your flight arrives early in the morning, you may wish to book a pre-trip hotel night so that you can rest when you arrive. There are no planned activities until an intro meeting around 6:00 or 7:00 p.m., usually in the hotel lobby. Check for a sign or ask at the reception desk about the exact time and location of the group meeting. Please make every effort to arrive in time for this meeting. If you are delayed and will arrive late, please inform us. Your tour leader will then leave you a message at the front desk informing you of where and when to meet up tomorrow.

After the meeting, you might choose to get dinner at a nearby restaurant with your traveling companions and your tour leader to further get to know one another.

Joining Instructions

When you arrive at the airport, you can either take a taxi or use public transportation to reach the hotel.

Via Taxi

A taxi costs €20 EUR during the hours of 7:00 am to 9:00 pm from Lisbon Airport to Lisbon City Center. During the hours of 9:00 pm to midnight, the cost is €25 EUR. Journey time should be roughly 20 minutes, give or take. Note that prices are estimates only. A surcharge can apply on weekends, bank holidays, and per piece of luggage.

**If you need a taxi in order to visit the city during your stay, you can ask the hotel how much it should cost and then deal with the driver. This way, no bad surprises occur with less-than-honest drivers!*

Via Aerobus

Shuttles run every 20 minutes, every day of the week, from 7:45 am to 8:15 pm. The Aerobus (Carris n. 91) runs between the Airport and the city center. Tickets can be purchased on board. Fare is €1.20 EUR for one ride, €3.10 EUR per 1-day ticket, and €2 EUR for a 1-day TAP Voucher. Journey time is roughly a 35-40 minute ride. Use Google Maps to figure out where you should get off the bus. We often use Residencial Florescente hotel. If that is the case, get off the bus at the “Restauradores” stop. Cross the square to the red “Correios” (post-office) building and take the street next to it. This will lead you directly to Rua Portas de Santo Antão. Turn left and you will find the hotel on your left.

Day 2: Lisbon Take an orientation walk. Explore Lisbon as you wish for the rest of the day. In the evening enjoy a Fado night and traditional Portuguese dinner in one of Lisbon's oldest neighborhoods.

Enjoy an orientation walk of Lisbon. The rest of the day is free for exploration. See our optional activities section further below for our suggestions on what to do with your time. If you have already explored Lisbon on the previous day, you could opt to take a day trip to Sintra in the foothills of the surrounding mountains.

In the evening, enjoy a Fado (Portuguese folk music) performance and traditional Portuguese dinner in one of Lisbon's oldest neighborhoods.

Accommodation: Residencial Florescente (*or similar*)

Meals included: Breakfast | Dinner

Day 3: Lisbon/Coimbra Travel to Batalha. Visit the historic Batalha Monastery with free time to wander the grounds. Continue to the medieval capital of Portugal, Coimbra.

Leave Lisbon behind and head north to the small hill town of Batalha. Visit the Batalha Monastery, which was built to commemorate the victory of the Portuguese over the Castilians at the battle of Aljubarrota in 1385. The elaborate, Gothic-style architecture of this UNESCO site is considered to be one of the masterpieces of the region.

If time permits, make a stop in the medieval town of Óbidos. If you're interested in visiting this town during your tour of Portugal, we recommend waiting to make arrangements for a day tour to Óbidos until Day 4.

Later, continue to the medieval capital of Portugal, Coimbra.

Approximate travel time: 2 hrs by private vehicle

Accommodation: Hotel Astoria Coimbra (*or similar*)

Meals included: Breakfast

Day 4: Coimbra Enjoy a free day to explore Coimbra. Opt to visit the famous Coimbra University, explore the winding streets and the riverfront filled with restaurants and bars.

You may choose to visit the famous Coimbra University, a UNESCO World Heritage site since 2013 (and also the inspiration for Harry Potter's Hogwarts). Portugal's most prestigious university, the University of Coimbra is a must-see landmark. The Joanina Library (Biblioteca Joanina) is one of the most ornate libraries in the world with its breathtaking frescoes, intricate carvings and gold-leaf touches.

Also in Coimbra you will find Conimbriga, the best-preserved Roman ruins in Portugal.

If you feel you have the time, you can opt for a day trip to the Templar city of Tomar.

Accommodation: Hotel Astoria Coimbra (*or similar*)

Meals included: Breakfast

Day 5: Coimbra/Porto Continue to the historic and vibrant coastal town of Porto in the morning, and take an orientation walk upon arrival.

Set aside the Douro River, Portugal's second city is one of the most interesting destinations in Europe. With its Medieval architecture, its Dom Luis I Bridge and Art Nouveau cafes, there's something for everyone.

Approximate travel time: 1.5 hrs by train
Accommodation: Ibis Porto Centro São Bento (*or similar*)
Meals included: Breakfast

Day 6: Porto Enjoy a free day in this UNESCO World Heritage city. In the evening, enjoy a visit to the port wine cellars and tasting.

Enjoy a free day to explore Porto. Opt take a cruise down the Douro Valley, or explore the city which gained UNESCO World Heritage designation in 1996. Head down Allias Avenue to see the French-inspired buildings. Bargain at the Bolhão Market. Wander the city's World Heritage-listed Ribeira district, visit São Francisco church, the palatial former 19th-century stock market Palácio de Bolsa or head to the Clerigos Tower for a panoramic view of the city.

We will finish off the day with a tour of the cellars of the region's famed export, Port wine. Learn about the art of Port making and the processes that render its rich taste. Indulge in a tasting and raise a glass to a day well spent. Saúde!

Accommodation: Ibis Porto Centro São Bento (*or similar*)
Meals included: Breakfast

Day 7: Porto / Madrid Catch a flight to Madrid and spend the rest of the day exploring the city at your own pace.

Hop on a plane to your next destination, the capital of Spain: Madrid.

Lively, passionate Madrid is a treasure trove of art and architecture, with its royal palaces and works by masters including Goya, Picasso, and Dalí. Be sure to take in some tapas. Madrid is one of the richest culinary capitals of Europe, and showcases food from all over Spain.

Kindly note there is a 20kg luggage weight restriction on this internal flight. Please make sure to plan your packing with this in mind.

Day 8: Madrid After a brief orientation walk, enjoy a full day to explore this bustling capital. Discover Plaza Mayor or opt to visit the famous Royal Palace. Indulge in delicious Spanish tapas or get your fix at the Prado Museum.

Day 9: Madrid/Granada Journey south to Granada. Upon arrival enjoy an orientation walk. Wander through the whitewashed historic quarter of the Albaicin; with its narrow lanes and fantastic views, it's a great place to watch the sunset.

Depending on the time of our bus, you will most likely have a bit more free time this morning to explore Madrid. We then travel by local bus south to Granada. Upon arrival, enjoy a brief orientation walk to get a feel for the city. We will wander through the historic quarter of the Albaicin and try to take in a sunset. With its narrow lanes and fantastic views back to the Alhambra, visitors are rewarded with a spectacular color-washed skyline when the sun goes down.

Approximate travel time: 4-4.5 hrs by local bus

Accommodation: Hotel Casa Palacio Pilar del Toro (*or similar*)

Meals included: Breakfast

Day 10: Granada Enjoy a guided visit to the architectural masterpiece, the Alhambra. In the evening, opt to go for a stroll and check out the local tapas and wine bars.

Enjoy a guided visit of the Alhambra, one of the greatest accomplishments of Islamic art and architecture. Learn about Granada's reign as one of the region's most regal cities during the Muslim rule of Spain, which is captured in time within the Alhambra. (Visits to the Alhambra may vary and take place on Day 3 or 4, depending on ticket availability, special events or holidays in Spain.)

After visiting the Alhambra, opt to take a wander through the historic city.

In the evening, opt for a night on the town. The city is filled with trendy tapas bars and has a lively music scene.

Accommodation: Hotel Casa Palacio Pilar del Toro (*or similar*)

Meals included: Breakfast

Day 11: Granada/Cordoba/Seville Travel to Seville via Cordoba. Stroll through the historic Jewish quarter and visit the iconic Mezquita de Cordoba (mosque). Then continue towards Seville with free time to get to know the city.

Today we travel to Seville via picturesque Cordoba.

Upon arrival in Cordoba we visit the city's most famous monument, the extraordinary Mezquita. Built as a mosque in 785 by the Moors, the Mezquita was converted in the 16th century by the remarkable addition of a Christian cathedral inserted into the center of the building. We highly recommend booking a guided tour to get a fuller understanding.

Afterward, we will wander among narrow winding lanes, traditional houses, and charming cafés in Cordoba's historic medieval Jewish quarter. Discover one of Spain's three remaining synagogues.

We will then travel to Seville by train. After checking into our hotel we will have free time to get to know the city.

Approximate travel time: 4 hrs by private vehicle

Accommodation: Cool Sevilla Hotel (*or similar*)

Meals included: Breakfast

Day 12: Seville Spend a day enjoying this city and its Moorish influence. Opt to explore the district of Santa Cruz, the Alcázar palace or the world's largest Gothic cathedral. End the day with a dramatic flamenco performance

Spend a day enjoying Seville and its Moorish influence. Opt to explore the interiors and gardens of the Alcázar, a magnificent palace dating from Moorish times, or the true heart of Seville, the Santa Cruz quarter— a charming area with winding alleys, picturesque lime-washed houses, flowery patios, and small squares.

Seville is home to the world's largest gothic cathedral — climb the adjoining tower for great views of the city. Other attractions include the Museo Arqueológico, the Casa de Pilatos and the Parque de María Luisa, which has a maze of paths, garden beds, pretty little patios, fountains, and shaded lawns.

At the end of the day, enjoy a flamenco performance in the city known for the energetic dance. Be swept away by the flamenco's passion, fire, and grit!

Please note that if you wish to visit popular sites and want to avoid waiting in line, it is advisable to reserve tickets in advance. We recommend pre-arranging your visit to the Alcázar of Seville.

Accommodation: Cool Sevilla Hotel (or similar)

Meals included: Breakfast

Day 13: Seville/Barcelona Hop on a train to Barcelona. Take an orientation walk, including visits to the Gothic Quarter and Las Ramblas. In the evening participate in a paella cooking class followed by a group dinner.

Hop on the train and get comfortable on the journey north to Barcelona. Take an orientation walk, including visits to the Gothic Quarter, the Boqueria market and Las Ramblas.

In the evening participate in a G Adventures-supported paella cooking class served and prepared by migrant students, followed by a group dinner to round out the day. Mescladis, Catalan for "Mixed Space," is a migrant training kitchen and cafe in the heart of Barcelona that features a unique feel that fuses old Catalan favorites and migrants' home recipes. With the help of migrant students, learn how to make paella with the resident chef, accompanied by a discussion that promotes social reflection - with the kitchen and food at the center of it all. Then enjoy the fruits of your labor!

Approximate travel time: 6 hrs by train

Accommodation: Hotel AA Viladomat Barcelona (or similar)

Meals included: Breakfast | Dinner

Day 14: Barcelona Depart Barcelona at any time.

There are no planned activities today, so you may depart Barcelona at any time. The nearest airport is Barcelona's **Josep Tarradellas Barcelona-El Prat Airport (BCN)**. If you wish to extend your stay in Barcelona, consider booking post-tour accommodation with us.

Please note that check-out time from the hotel is usually mid-morning, but luggage storage services are available at the reception desk.
